## Thought for the Week – from Caroline

God can do anything, you know - far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest **dreams!** (Ephesians 3:20, The Message)

I am very surprised that some people will not watch the film "The Shack" as they say it's blasphemous. I do not know how they come to this conclusion as God can do anything, appear in any way and speak in any way. He's not bound by our prejudices or our rigid thinking and limitations. "The Shack" is packed full of wisdom, insight and the revelation of God's immense love and grace to us even when we are far from Him. It covers guilt, forgiveness, anger, hatred, bitterness, grief, judgement, mercy, and the struggle we have to overcome. The Shack is the vision given to the main character Mac, it's personal to Mac and God spoke to and taught Mac in a way tailored for him. God chose to appear as a woman to Mac because He knew that because of Mac's damaged relationship with his abusive father he wouldn't be able to relate to a father figure (God's brilliance), and anyway why shouldn't God appear as a woman? God created woman, He created every little detail of the feminine nature. Also God the Father portrayed not only as a woman but as a black woman is to me a brilliant move as well, for too long black people have had to put up with Jesus portrayed as white and in some absurd cases as blonde and blue-eyed. So, as Ephesians 3:20 says, God can do anything. in Numbers 22:21-39 God spoke through a donkey, is that blasphemy?
