Thought for the Week – from Caroline

Matthew 23:13

"Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You shut the door of the kingdom of heaven in people's faces. You yourselves do not enter, nor will you let those enter who are trying to."

This was the fourth woe out of seven woes and Jesus refers to hypocrisy in this one. The Pharisees paid a great deal of attention to outward ordinances and actions that would make them appear righteous, but they were not concerned about being righteous in their hearts, just appearing so. Jesus called them hypocrites.

Hypocrisy appears a lot in the world, not just in a religious context. People can appear to say wonderful, noble and righteous things (the devil is a master of it) and people will "hang on" their every word, especially if they are well-known. People will want to be seen as agreeing and join the "bandwagon." We have seen it on a number of issues in the church, sadly.

There is a famous Hans Christian Andersen story of the Emperor's new clothes. The Emperor was renowned for his grand wardrobe. Two swindlers came to town boasting of their fine linen and that anybody who couldn't see it would not be fit for office. They started to weave, but actually there was nothing there, they were pretending. When the Emperor walked out displaying their finished work, he was actually naked. Everybody admired his outfit and went along with the crowds, not admitting what was in their hearts. You need to read the whole story for yourselves. This story is often used to describe a situation in which people are afraid to criticize something because everyone else seems to think it's good.

There is so much self-deception as people just don't know themselves, that why it says in the bible to examine yourself. Psalm 139:23-24: "Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!"

Just because somebody says something that appears, noble, compassionate, and righteous, doesn't mean that it's right.

Isaiah 55:8-9

"For My thoughts are not your thoughts,

neither are your ways My ways,"

declares the Lord.

"As the heavens are higher than the earth,

so are My ways higher than your ways

and My thoughts than your thoughts."
