Thought For The Week – from Caroline

Most of all, let love guide your life, for then the whole church will stay together in perfect harmony. (*Colossians 3:14 TLB*)

As I won't be with you on Sunday to share with you my take on the Church Weekend, this seemed a good place to do it. I chose the above scripture because the Church Weekend gives us the opportunity to learn a bit more about each other and to enjoy fellowship with one another. I felt that this particular church weekend was one of our best. It could be that I'm stronger now, not so battered by emotional turmoil or disgruntled with church as I have been on some past Church Weekends. But even then, as it is for some now who have major problems, Church Weekend gives us a stepping stone on our journey to growth and maturity. And the teaching of this 2025 one was, in my view, exceptional. I loved the teaching style of Joel & Caz, they opened up the story of Jonah so well, taking a magnifying glass view of all the details of the situation, showing us Jonah's character and how we too can be like him. I heard Ian say, and I thought it myself, we don't know what happened in Jonah's life for him to hate the Ninevites so much, and I too have wanted severe judgment on someone who hurt me badly; in fact wouldn't we secretly want them to suffer, or maybe you are more saintly than me, but Proverbs 24:17 says, "Do not gloat when your enemy falls; when they stumble, do not let your heart rejoice, ..." Fortunately, I no longer think like that, but the Church Weekend encouraged me to examine other issues in my life as we are all a work in progress. Joel and Caz showed us so many different perspectives of the story, and we need to look at situations in our lives from a different perspective. The preacher/teacher J.
