Thought for the Week – from Caroline

Psalm 106:7 *When our ancestors were in Egypt, they gave no thought to your miracles, they did not remember your many kindnesses and they rebelled by the sea, the Red Sea.*

Even though God did all those amazing miracles in Egypt and brought the Israelites out into freedom from their slavery, there was an outpouring of fear when they reached the shores of the Red Sea. They heard the thunder of the approaching mighty Egyptian Army behind them and the vast Red Sea in front of them. The Psalm says they rebelled, we often think of the term rebelling as aggression, fighting, or downright disobedience. The Israelites saw the enormity of an impossible situation, they were terrified, they didn't trust that God, even though they had seen incredible miracles, could possibly save them this time. In their minds they were doomed. How often do we panic in situations and forget that God is the God of the impossible? I know I do. I don't think of myself as rebelling when that happens but I suppose not trusting God when He promises so much is an affront to God. Fortunately God is incredibly understanding and knows us inside out, He knows the things that have happened to us that have bred insecurities in us and He also knows we have all had different experiences in life. He therefore deals with each of us individually, same standards (not rules) but in the same way a parent may deal with a very young child or a teenager. I hope you understand what I mean as that's the best way I can explain it.
